European Cabin Crew Regulations – a comprehensive source of information

Four aviation industry organisations – The Association of European Airlines (AEA), the European Transport Workers' Federation (ETF), the European Regions Airline Association (ERA) and the International Air Carrier Association (IACA) – have published a survey comparing the legal rules and regulations governing Cabin Crew Licensing, Recruitment and Training Requirements in the Member States of the EU.

The report, prepared by the EGOA Public Affairs Consultancy and supported by the European Commission (DG-EMPL), describes the rules in each country in a straightforward and standardised format:

- The legal base of the rules governing Cabin Crew and the responsibilities regarding compliance;
- The regulatory qualification requirements for Cabin Crew Recruitment;
- The regulatory qualification requirements for Cabin Crew Training
- The national laws regarding Cabin Crew Licensing/Certification/Attestation.

As European rules harmonise, and crew members routinely pursue cross-border job opportunities, the report is a valuable industry resource which illustrates the similarities and the differences in the regulatory situation, country by country.
